XIV. Finance Report

Gillian Stoettner

The Finance committee met 4 times throughout the year in December, February, March and April.

Work for the Finance Committee included reviewing and approving the 2017 Audit; reviewing investment accounts; reviewing and approving budgets for the WB Office, Gift Shop, Fall Benefit and Spring Luncheon; reviewing salaries and approving bonuses for the office staff, setting up the new Northern Trust Lock Box and appropriating available funds to hospital programs and other Chicago west side initiatives within the Rush Community.

Audit Review

In December, Sarah Hughes and Kathleen Candela from Deloitte presented the audit for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017. The Woman's Board is in good financial standing and is in accordance with all generally accepted accounting principles.

Summary of Investment Accounts

JP Morgan

On June 30, 2018, our portfolio Value was \$1,622,908.57. \$743,340.70 in equities, \$166,291.42 in alternative assets and \$712,051.57 in cash and fixed income. We had accruals of \$1,224.88.

Northern Trust

The Woman's Board also maintains a combined Checking/Money Market investment account with Northern Trust. We earn minimal interest on our funds. As of June 30, 2018, our account total was \$1,123,381.01.

The combined total equals \$2,746,289.58.

Budgets

Office

Administrative Budget expenses of \$297,859 were approved for FY2019. This amount is approximately \$7,872 higher than last year's budget due to accounting expenses and salary increases.

Gift Shop

The Gift Shop Budget for FY2019 was approved with expected Operating income of \$159,078 added to Other Income of \$229,704 for a total expected net income of \$388,782.

Fall Benefit

The Fall Benefit Budget for FY 2019 was approved with an expected income of \$655,000 and expenses of \$283,220 for a net of \$371,780.

Spring Luncheon

The Spring Luncheon budget for FY2019 was approved with expected income of \$192,000 and expenses of \$189,025 for a net of \$2,975. This event budget is the hardest to create, as it correlates strongly to whom the speaker will be, and the venue booked. Also, when this budget is made, that current fiscal year's Spring Luncheon has not taken place, so no

additional information/knowledge can be applied. In recent years the Spring Luncheon has thrived based on event chair(s), an exciting speaker, and solid attendance.

Events

Fall Benefit

Under the leadership of Pam Fitzgerald, Income and expense for the November 3, 2017 Fall Benefit (FY 2018) were \$669,788.11 and \$242,895.40 respectively netting \$426,892.71. Fall of 2018 will be our second year in the new format. We continue to define what this benefit should look like after 90 years of a successful Fashion Show.

Spring Luncheon

Under the leadership of Lindsey Axel and Kate Mursau, the income and expense for the May 3, 2018 event were \$254,593 and \$158,855 respectively netting \$95,738. Madeline Albright captured the audience with stories of her various jobs, history around those jobs, and her clothing pin collection.

Appropriations

The annual appropriations meeting was held at the Woman's Athletic Club on April 24th, 2018. Requests for funding hit an all-time high at \$702,274.00. The Finance Committee approved the following appropriations from the Woman's Board funds of \$527,758.00 to the following departments, projects and programs:

\$25,000 to Kids-SHIP, Women's & Children's Hospital

\$500.00 to Pediatric Endocrinology

In total, \$382,324.00 was allocated to the afore mentioned departments, projects and programs.

\$100,000 of the remaining \$185,434.00 was designated to the Woman's Board Principal Project Fund. \$85,434.00 was carried over to the next fiscal year.

Hospital Departments that requested funds, but were denied, either did not meet the Woman's Board criteria for funding or were thought to be better served by either the hospital or some other source of funding, and/or were requests where questions of the program's viability and/or consistency and cohesiveness were raised.

The Board ended the year in strong financial standing.
